


A special thanks and acknowledgement go to the following members:

In Search of Farth's Secrets

On Thursday, December 2, 2021, twenty STEM girls from West Oso Junior High School joined volunteers from the American Association of University Women Corpus Christi Branch and Texas A&M University – Corpus Christi Noyce Scholars in a training session on the National Science Foundation funded Pop-Up Science Exhibit, *In Search of Earth's Secrets*. This exhibit shares information from the international research vessel, JOIDES, that obtains core samples of the ocean floor. With the training

they received, these students will be docents when the exhibit comes to John F. Kennedy






SPECIAL COMMITTEE NEWS: BOOKFINDERS
